INTRODUCTION

LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Families fleeing impossible living conditions often find themselves in a struggle for survival in neighbouring places that already lack basic services such as sanitation, education and healthcare.

This year our teams confronted these situations: in the slums of Mumbai where villagers come looking for work; in Nepal due to natural disasters, and; with refugees on the Italian border. Similarly, projects are underway for the benefit of: informal settlements around Soweto in South Africa; unregistered immigrants in Belize, and; unrecognized mountain communities in Honduras who fled the hurricanes.

A healthy smile is basic for physical and psychological health and development, but for these vulnerable communities, teeth blackened with decay, toothache and infection are their reality, while oral care is in the realm of fantasy.

In 2018 we developed innovative and effective models of oral health promotion that are culturally, socially and environmentally sensitive and provide sustainable solutions to the specific needs and circumstances of each community. That is not enough.

To make a true impact these models need to be proven, shared and ultimately adopted by government or other executive players. That will be our focus in 2019 and beyond.

In order to meet these aims, this past year was characterized by professional development and organisational growth. *Operations & Development, Marketing & Communications* and *Science* departments were hatched. New talented *Humble Smile Ambassadors, Fellows, Clinics* and *Advisors* joined and contributed. Numerous organizations sought our collaboration. PROMOTING HEALTH AND CHANGING LIVES BY GIVING SMILES

Oral health is fundamental to general health and well-being. Poor oral health affects quality of life as a result of pain or discomfort, tooth loss, impaired oral functioning, disfigurement, missing school time, loss of work hours and sometimes even death.

3.5 billion people worldwide are affected by oral diseases and conditions, including untreated tooth decay, severe periodontitis, and tooth loss. **In fact, world-wide, nearly 60-90% of school children, have cavities, and untreated caries in adult teeth is the most prevalent of all medical conditions!**

Thanks to the generous support of so many individuals, dental professionals, corporate and fellow non-profit partners, we were able to promote oral health around the globe. We provided **41650 Humble Brushes** to **18 different communities** with the support of The Humble Company. We touched the lives of young and old, from disadvantaged children in Mumbai slums to Gogos in the Ndebele Kingdom.

With your help, we promoted oral and general health. We advocated for the adoption of local health policies. We connected dental students from around the world. We trained caregivers, particularly women, on nutrition, hygiene and health. Project: Gogos Give Smiles

Location: Ndebele Kingdom, South Africa

Sponsors: The Humble Company

Implementation Partners: IADS; Inknonjani Womens Network; Ndebele King Makhonse II

In February – March 2018 Humble Smile Foundation conducted its International Dental Student Volunteer Project in the Ndebele Kingdom in South Africa. A lack of oral hygienic practices and unhealthy nutritional habits set the community at risk, especially the younger generations.

The grandmothers (gogos), who take a crucial role as care-givers and educators of the children in the homes and schools, were deeply involved in the development and execution of the activities during Humble Smile’s Gogos Give Smiles pilot project. Their involvement was crucial in developing the three-day model for implementation of the school-based oral health promotion project for a sustainable impact on the children and their community at large: Day I – Investigation - to learn about the school & kids’ OH status. Day II – Capacity Building Workshop (Veza Gogo Club Workshop) in Mhupalunga - to build relations, educate and empower the Gogos to promote oral health in the school (advocacy) and at home (help building confidence in their traditional foods and remedies). Day III – Field - to set up tooth brushing stations and other preventive activities at school with the Gogos. This model was applied to two schools.

Humble Smile’s in-school program was successful in introducing new habits in the school routine. Gogos gained more knowledge in oral health and nutrition and were better able to change behaviors of children towards healthy lifestyles that include daily tooth brushing and decreased consumption of sweets and sugary beverages. Lastly, dental student volunteers enjoyed the experience and learnt about the value of preventative oral health measures to support oral health for communities in need.

Location: Kalwa, Greater Mumbai, India

Life in the slum of Kalwa is a challenging existence, with children experiencing difficulties that defy imagination. There is an extremely high amount of tooth decay in this community. The lack of money causes families to make constant calculations as to whether they can afford toothpaste and tooth brushes.

Family members therefore often share toothbrushes and limit tooth brushing to a maximum of one time per day before breakfast. Furthermore, the lack of oral health education in public schools and private surroundings and the high consumption of sweets and use of tobacco affect the oral health of school children.

Improving hygiene and nutritional habits is crucial for the development of children and their long-term health.

Our local implementation partner, Gabriel Project Mumbai, is deeply involved in the execution of the school project that includes daily-supervised tooth brushing after the children's school meals and basic oral health awareness raising activities. As a result, the children have the skills and habit to brush their teeth properly on a daily basis.

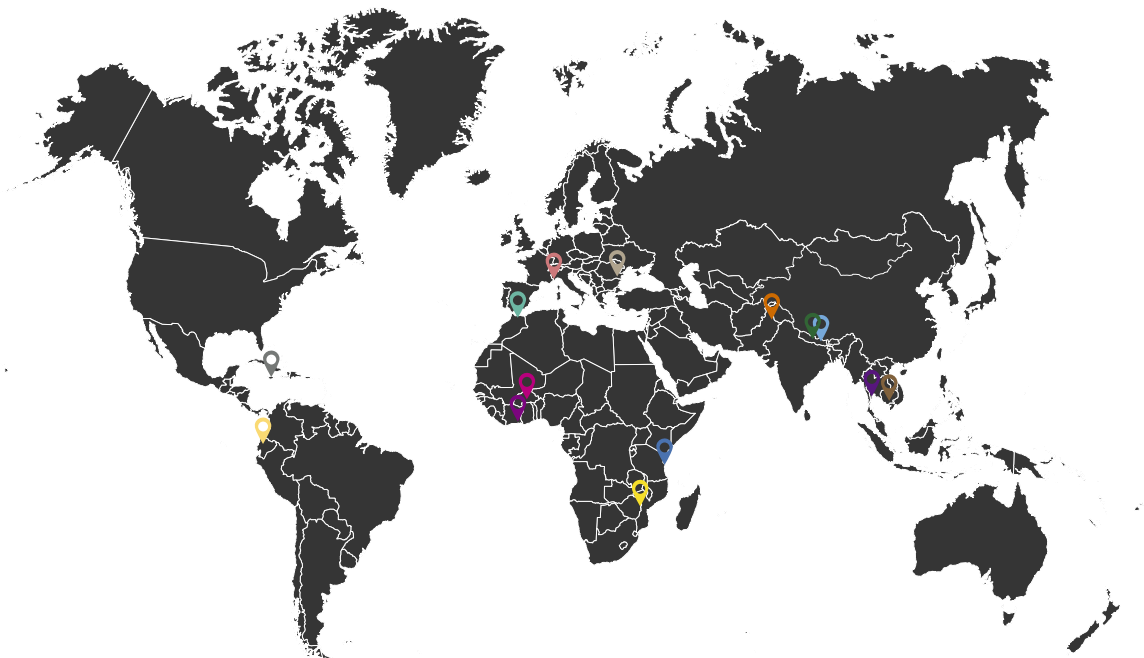

SUPPORT PROJECT IN THE SPOTLIGHT

Location: Koudougou, Burkina Faso

In Burkina Faso over 1.5 million children are at risk of food insecurity, with around 350,000 children in need of emergency medical assistance. Only 11.4% of children under the age of 2 receive the daily recommended number of meals, and stunted growth affects at least a third of the population. Oral health problems are one of the many challenges children in remote communities are facing. Overall, Burkina Faso has only 1 dentist for 185,00 people.



Last year, our Humble Smile Ambassador Dr Mark Sebastian from Munich provided clinical treatment as well as capacity training in preventive dentistry at a gender equality promoting school - Lycee de Schorge Koudougou. The Humble Co. has been supporting this project since 2016 and donated 800 Humble Brushes in 2018.



STORIES FROM THE FIELD

'I tell my mother that if she doesn't brush her teeth, no one wants to be friends with her'

For a child that lives in a 6 square meter house in the Kalwa slums whereby the family has a limited income of 333 INR (4.7 USD) a day, his or her childhood is a challenging reality. Such is the case of Amit (9), who lives with his mother, father, sister, and uncle in a tiny house in the Bhaskar Nagar neighbourhood in the slums of Kalwa. Clean running water is a luxury and so he helps his sister to get water from the water pump in his neighbourhood every week.

Amit loves sweets. Three times a week he receives 2 Rupees from his father. He then immediately runs to the nearest candy shop next to his house. Before Amit joined the Gabriel Smiles tooth brushing project in his GPM pre-school of the Gabriel Project Mumbai, he brushed his teeth only occasionally when he woke up, just before he got a little bit of food for breakfast from his mother. Amit's teeth were yellow and sometimes he went to school with painful teeth. Focusing and participating in class was very difficult for him.

For two years Amit brushes his teeth on a daily basis after his school meal and he has learned more about his mouth at his pre-school. He loves the feeling of a clean mouth and he feels his teeth became whiter ever since. He also finds it important that other family members take care of their mouth: "I often tell my mother that if she doesn't brush her teeth after eating she will have bad breath and no one would want to be friends with her."

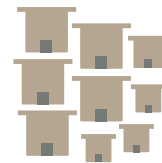

Gabriel Project Mumbai



Gabriel Project Mumbai (GPM) is a grassroots organization that is situated in the center of the Kalwa slums of Thane, Greater Mumbai, India. GPM works in collaboration with other NGOs, businesses and communal leaders in order to advance the most effective solutions for Kalwa's children and their entire community. In the second half of 2015 Humble Smile Foundation and GPM established a partnership with the formation of the Gabriel Smiles tooth brushing school project in the Kalwa slums.

With the launch of GPM's first dental clinic within their health program in Kalwa, Humble Smile Foundation and GPM decided to upscale their collaborative oral health prevention program in order to maximize the health impact of the community in 2019 and beyond.



Oral Health Promoter in the Spotlight

'Humble Smile is teaching me to do more things than what I was'



When Constance was a young girl, she was raised by her own grandmother, a Gogo, who meant a lot to her. However, Constance's life has not been an easy one. She liked going to school a lot, but by her 3rd year in High School her father got sick and she was forced to work in the city to help earn an income for her family. When she was in her 30s she furthered her education by doing a business course. Nonetheless, the more successful Constance became, the more violent her husband became. After he broke her hands, Constance decided to divorce from him. She started to work as a maid and child minder in Johannesburg. But when the mother of the house remarried, the new husband said 'he did not want a black person to look after the children'.

At the age of 60 Constance returned to the Ekangala in the Ndebele Kingdom (Province of Mpumalanga, edit.), where she currently still lives. She founded her first Gogo club, Veza Ukhono, to do physical exercises with fellow Gogos.

As the leader of her Gogo Club, Constance got connected to the community school where Humble Smile Foundation was executing its oral health mission. After participating in the organization's Capacity Building Training on well-being, oral hygiene, and nutrition, she became an active promoter of oral health for the children of her community and supported fellow Gogos to join the Gogos Give Smiles project. This is very important for her:

'I wished all the schools could take out all the sweets. But oh what they eat at school is very bad! Humble Smile has taught us something we didn't know. (...) It seems God has given me as a talent of teaching old people, and Humble Smile is teaching me to do more things than what I was. I am proud about Humble Smile.'

Her wish for our next project? *'Let Gogos Give Smiles continue and be big. And for other coming Gogos they must see us where we are and follow us. Because when we are together, we can do things better. When we are with Gogos, we give people straight things. This is what Gogos pass on to their grandchildren.'*

Report on the annual accounts

Opinions

I have audited the annual accounts of Humble Smile Foundation for the year 2018.

In my opinion, the annual accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Annual Accounts Act and present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Association as at 31 December 2018 and its financial performance and cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with the Annual Accounts Act. The statutory administration report is consistent with the other parts of the annual accounts.

I therefore recommend that the Annual General Meeting adopts the income statement and balance sheet.

Basis for Opinions

I have conducted my audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (ISA) and generally accepted auditing standards in Sweden. My responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities* section. I am independent of the Association in accordance with professional ethics for accountant in Sweden and have otherwise fulfilled my ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements.

I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my opinions.

Responsibilities of the Board of Directors

The Board of Directors is responsible for the preparation of the annual accounts and that they give a fair presentation in accordance with the Annual Accounts Act. The Board of Directors is also responsible for such internal control as they determine is necessary to enable the preparation of annual accounts that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the annual accounts, the Board of Directors is responsible for the assessment of the Association's ability to continue as a going concern. They disclose, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting. The going concern basis of accounting is however not applied if the Board of Directors intend to liquidate the Association, to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Auditor's responsibility

My objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the annual accounts as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes my opinions. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in

accordance with ISAs and generally accepted auditing standards in Sweden will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these annual accounts.

As part of an audit in accordance with ISAs, I exercise professional judgement and maintain professional scepticism throughout the audit. I also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatements of the annual accounts, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my opinions. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, internal omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- Obtain an understanding of the Association's internal control relevant to my audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion of the effectiveness of the Association's internal control.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by the Board of Directors.
- Conclude on the appropriateness of the Board of Director's use of the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the annual accounts. I have also draw a conclusion, based on the audit evidence obtained, as to whether any material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the Association's ability to continue as a going concern. If I conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in my auditor's report to the related disclosures in the annual accounts or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify my opinion about the annual accounts. My conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of my auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Association to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the annual accounts, including the disclosures, and whether the annual accounts represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

I must inform the Board of Directors of, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit. I must also inform of significant audit findings during my audit, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that I have identified.

I recommend to the Annual General Meeting that the members of the Board of Directors be discharged from liability for the financial year.

Basis for Opinion

I conducted the audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards in Sweden. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor’s Responsibilities* section. I am independent of the Association in accordance with professional ethics for accountants in Sweden and have otherwise fulfilled our ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements.

I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Responsibilities of the Board of Directors

The Board of Directors is responsible for the administration.

Auditor’s responsibility

Our objective concerning the audit of the administration, and thereby our opinion about discharge from liability, is to obtain audit evidence to assess with a reasonable degree of assurance whether any member of the Board of Directors in any material respect has undertaken any action or been guilty of any omission which can give rise to liability to the Association.

Reasonable security is a high degree of security, but no guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards in Sweden will always detect actions or omissions that can give rise to liability to the Association.

As part of an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards in Sweden, I exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. The examination of the administration is based primarily on the audit of the accounts. Additional audit procedures performed are based on our professional judgment with starting point in risk and materiality. This means that I focus the examination on such actions, areas and relationships that are material for the operations and where deviations and violations would have particular importance for the Association’s situation. I examine and test decisions undertaken, support for decisions, actions taken and other circumstances that are relevant to our opinion concerning discharge from liability.

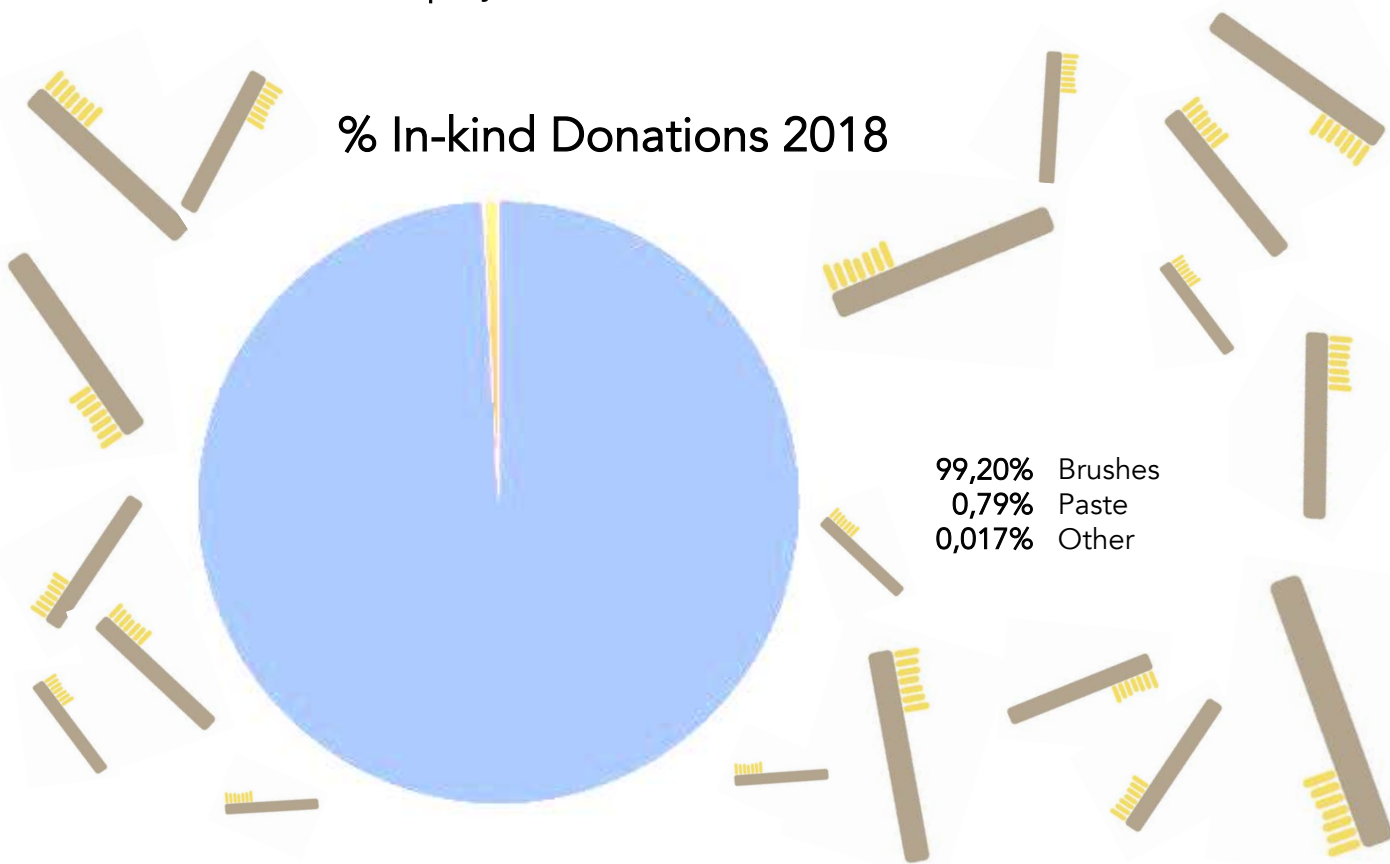


IN-KIND DONATIONS
